**During 2013, Groton Base's K4K Shipmates** brought comfort and joy to hundreds of sick Children, and their families. Below are 10 visit reports, with photos.

We give Children caring attention, and make them Honorary Submariners.

Children receive an Honorary Submariner Certificate, Honorary Submariner Cap or Doo Rag, K4K Wristband, K4K Tattoo, photo of a Submarine signed by Sub Vets, brochure from the **Historic Ship Nautilus and Submarine Force Museum** and a brochure from the **World War II National Submarine Memorial - East**. The museum and memorial are both in Groton, CT.

We let them know that they would get special treatment from Sub Vet Docents if they wore their Caps or Doo Rags when they visited the museum. We also encouraged them to have their parents take them to the memorial before or after visiting the museum.

We answer their questions and share information about Submarines, Submariners, and our history, which significantly advances the reason the **United States Submarine Veterans Inc. (USSVI)** exists.

The staff at the hospital was very pleased with the joy given to their Children and requested the Long Island Base visit as often as possible! Long Island Base Commander Mike Zemser and Base Kap(SS) 4 Kid(SS) Chairman Ed Wylie sent their thanks to Groton Base for the assistance.

**On April 17th**, Paul Dillon, Rich Lukas, Buzz Merritt and John & Jackie Riley visited the Children in the In-Patient Child Psychiatric Program at Saint Raphael Hospital in New Haven, CT. This was our 5th visit to the Kids at St Rays. We made Honorary Submariners of the 19 teenagers.



This was the first time all the Kids visited were teenagers and the hospital staff was amazed that they were all fully engaged in our presentation and discussions. We were thanked by the Kids, the Program Coordinator, all the staff, and were requested to continue to visit as often as we can.

**On May 23<sup>rd</sup>**, Norm and Ella Mae Kuzel, Charlie Murray and John & Jackie Riley visited the Kids at **Yale New Haven Children's Hospital (YNHCH) and the Smilow Cancer Hospital, in New Haven, CT.** We made Honorary Submariners of 27 Children.

All of the Children at **Smilow Cancer Hospital** and many of the Children at **YNHCH** had family members visiting with them. The family members were very appreciative of what our K4K Program provided to their young loved ones.



We were thanked many times for the comfort and joy we brought to the Kids, as well as for our service to our country. It was a very rewarding visit!

This program is for Children 12 years of age and younger and supplements **St Raphael Hospital's** program which treats Children 13 to 18 years of age.

We made Honorary Submariners of 20 boys and girls. It was a great visit with the Kids! They had lots of questions. One little girl even asked the wives what it was like to be married to a Submariner. The staff was overjoyed with how engaged the Kids were. They were just as engaged as the Kids and asked us to visit as often as we could!

**On June 25<sup>th</sup>,** Groton Base Westport Satellite Group Sub Vets Mike DeLeo, Roy Wilkes and Buzz Merritt, with John & Jackie Riley, visited Children at **Bridgeport Hospital, in Bridgeport, CT.** This was our 4th visit to the **Bridgeport Hospital.** 



We visited the Kids in the hospital's Activity Room and made Honorary Submariners of 11 boys and girls. The Kids had lots of questions which we enjoyed answering. They were very excited about becoming Honorary Submariners and receiving the gifts we presented them.

As usual, the hospital staff asked us to return to visit the Children as often as we can, and we promised to do so.

**On December 11<sup>th</sup>**, Norm & Ella Mae Kuzel, Mike DeLeo, Roy Wilkes, Ron Grabowski, Buzz Merritt and John & Jackie Riley visited **Saint Raphael Hospital in New Haven, CT**.

Before we saw the Kids we visited with **Bill Lehr**, a **WW II Submarine Veteran**, and friend, who was in St Rays for treatment of pneumonia. Bill was very happy to see us and we thoroughly enjoyed our visit with him!



We then visited and made Honorary Submariners of the 20 teenagers in the hospital's **In-Patient Child Psychiatric Program.** This is the maximum number of Kids the hospital can treat in this program.

The visit with the Kids went exceptionally well. The staff was amazed again at how the Kids respond to us. They said the Kids (all teenagers) were all having a really hard time this week and that our visit made a huge positive difference. Our sharing of our Submarine knowledge and experience really engaged the Kids! The addition of the K4K Wrist Bands, K4K Tattoos and Christmas themed stuffed animals that Buzz provided, were also hits! We were thanked by the Kids, the Program Coordinator, all the staff, and were requested to continue to visit as often as we can. The visits we make to the Kids at St Rays are uniquely rewarding and we intend to visit as often as possible.
